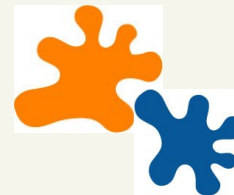

School Uniform

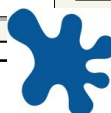
Beginning in January, JIMS students will be sporting a new look.
